What to Do in Lazio

A guide to tourist activities in the Lazio region, with a selection of nature trails, seaside destinations, villages of art, and historical and religious sites prepared for guests of the property.

Hiking trails and nature

- **Cacume Mount** — One of the most iconic peaks in the area, with a circular excursion through woods and ridges and spectacular views of the plain and the Tyrrhenian Sea. Distance: 10 km.
- **Antullo Well** — Impressive natural sinkhole over 100 meters deep, surrounded by a beech forest. A unique geological landscape. Distance: 45 km.
- **Canterno Lake** — Naturalistic oasis with a lakeside walk, ideal for relaxing, bird watching, and picnicking. Distance: 35 km.
- **Falvaterra and Rio Obaco Caves** — Karst complex with a path that can be visited among stalactites, streams, and a striking gorge. Suitable for both adults and children. Distance: 30 km.
- **Collepardo Caves** — Fascinating natural caves with limestone formations, rich in history and easily accessible. Distance: 45 km.

Seaside destinations

- **Sperlonga** — One of the most beautiful seaside villages in Italy, with golden beaches, crystal-clear waters, and a picturesque historic center. The Tiberius Cave and the Archaeological Museum are also worth seeing. Distance: 50 km.
- **Gaeta** — A coastal town with seven beaches, Monte Orlando Park, the Split Mountain, and a medieval quarter overlooking the gulf. Vibrant and authentic. Distance: 70 km.
- **San Felice Circeo** — An elegant destination at the foot of Mount Circeo, with crystal-clear sea, a historic center on a hill, and a natural reserve. Distance: 50 km.
- **Terracina** — Sandy beaches and a wide seaside promenade. A must-see is the Temple of Jupiter Anxur, with breathtaking views. Distance: 40 km.
- **Serapo (Gaeta)** — The most famous beach in Gaeta, with golden sand, shallow water, and clean sea. Perfect for families. Distance: 70 km.

Villages and cities of art

- **Castro dei Volsci** — A charming hilltop village known as the “Balcony of Ciociaria,” with stone alleys, a brigandage museum, and breathtaking views. Distance: 15 km.
- **Anagni** — The City of the Popes, famous for its splendid Romanesque cathedral with a frescoed crypt and a historic center full of charm. Distance: 40 km.
- **Ferentino** — An ancient town with cyclopean walls, an acropolis, a cathedral, and medieval streets of great historical and architectural value. Distance: 30 km.
- **Alatri** — Famous for its acropolis and imposing polygonal walls, it is known as the “City of the Cyclops.” Distance: 35 km.
- **Veroli** — A panoramic and spiritual village, with a cathedral featuring the Holy Stairs and the Giovardian Library. Distance: 35 km.
- **Sermoneta** — An exemplary, perfectly preserved medieval village dominated by Caetani Castle and rich in historic charm. Distance: 40 km.
- **Priverno** — A lively and authentic historic center, located a few kilometers from the beautiful Abbey of Fossanova. Distance: 20 km.

Historical and religious sites

- **Fossanova Abbey** — One of the oldest Cistercian masterpieces in Italy, surrounded by greenery, where St. Thomas Aquinas died. Distance: 20 km.
- **Certosa di Trisulti** — A monastery in the woods with a historic pharmacy, library, and breathtaking views of the Ernici Mountains. Distance: 50 km.
- **Castle of Fumone** — A mysterious medieval fortress known for the imprisonment of Celestine V, with hanging gardens and panoramic views. Distance: 40 km.
- **Acropolis of Alatri** — A monumental pre-Roman megalithic structure, with cyclopean walls still perfectly preserved. Distance: 35 km.
- **Casamari Abbey** — One of the best-preserved Cistercian monastic complexes in Europe, with Gothic architecture, mystical silence, and a historic pharmacy. Distance: 40 km.
